XXV General Synod of the P.N.C.C. Recap Our Truth, Our Work, Our Struggle, Our Victory October 1-3, 2018 – Belleville, IL

The Prime Bishop, Bishops, Priests, Deacons and elected Parish Delegates from parishes across the USA and Canada convened at the Lady of the Shrine Retreat and Convention Center reviewing the work and achievements of the past four years in our National Church with many reports and setting goals for the next 4 years for our General Church and parishes. The General Synod is the highest authority of the Church and all decisions are binding upon all parishes.


Our delegates, Fr. Bruce, David Kost and Marian Sleczkowski represented Holy Family along with Wendy Blotzer, representing the National United Choirs and Irene Jugan, representing the PNU added to Holy Family's presence at the Synod during the long and late-night sessions which were convened. Financially, Holy Family met its obligations. Prime Bishop Anthony Mikovsky was reelected as Prime Bishop, a constitutional change was made, removing the retirement age restriction of Prime Bishops. The most important focus of the Synod was the Future Directions program for the next 4 years which will require the support and involvement of every parishioner. More information will follow and be presented in upcoming bulletins and at the parish annual meeting. Elected to our Diocese's Supreme Council representatives were Diane Cheek from Mt. Pleasant, PA and Robert Giczkowski from Lancaster, NY. David Kost was named to the National Mission & Evangelism Commission.

We know that in all churches, parish attendance is down, especially among young families in our country. It is evident in our own parish. Other interests have replaced God in their lives. It will be our challenge to reach out and bring them back to God and worship as the Body of Christ. It was very evident that the Synod placed continuing the Mission of Christ a priority and none of us can just sit back resting on past laurels. The church doors must be opened to all and change if need be, accepted. 1 Corinthians 12: 12-27 must be adapted otherwise we collapse the Mission of Christ in our parish. Now the hard work of the Synod must begin. Are we all willing to accept it?

27th Sunday Ordinary Time

First Reading: Genesis 2: 18-24
Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 128
Second Reading: Hebrews 2: 9-11

Gospel: Mark 10: 2-16



"Mark 10: 15

Readings: From our first reading, God made man and woman for each other. The bond of marriage means they are no longer two but one. In the Book of Hebrews, we read that by entering fully into human life. By experiencing the bitterness of death, Christ became a brother and a savior to all people. Jesus teaches that the marriage bond comes from God and that it should be permanent and indissoluble. Therefore, a successful marriage always must include Christ and His Bride, the Church in the marriage bond. As children, we come to Him with unwavering faith and trust.

Reflection: Today we tackle the issue of marriage and divorce; Jesus is asked an awkward question about the legality of divorce. He lays down very clearly that what God intends for marriage is what is found in Genesis (where the "two become one" for all time) rather than the dispensation granted through Moses (permitting a writ of divorce) which was an exception, not the rule. Here it is clear that Jesus abrogates this Old Testament procedure - a point emphasized when the disciples press him further on this issue on getting back home. While it is important for us to be sensitive and understanding towards those whose marriages have gone awry, we must be careful to let the teachings of the Lord speak for themselves.

Praying: Heavenly Father, we pray that all marriages be successful and always include You in them as well as our openness to receive God's Kingdom with the simplicity of children through Jesus Christ our Lord.
