

#### Why Attend Mass & School of Christian Living? Over the past decade considerable research has emerged that demonstrates the benefits of religious practice and education within society. Religious practice promotes the well-being of individuals, families, and the community. Regular attendance at religious services and education is linked to healthy, stable family life, strong marriages, and well-behaved children. The practice of Religion also leads to a reduction in the incidence of domestic abuse, crime, substance abuse, and addiction. In addition, religious practice leads to an increase in physical and mental health, longevity, and education attainment. Moreover, these effects are intergenerational, as grandparents and parents pass on the benefits to the next generations. Parents, therefore it is your duty to send your child to SOCL. Religious education is important because it equips your child with cultural, social, moral and spiritual knowledge that aids in mental and physical development within society. The lessons learned in religious education prepare children for responsibilities, experiences and opportunities later in life. Religious education assists students in forming values and beliefs that are reflected in behaviors and communication. For example, when approached with an ethical or moral dilemma, people with religious education can reflect on the teachings of the church to make a decision that is in line with their values and beliefs. Religious education is also important because the information prompts people to challenge ideas and questions about their purpose in life, their beliefs about God and what it means to co-exist with others in a peaceful environment. The knowledge offers guidance for how to behave in line with religious traditions and world views of the church, and often prompts people to put others before themselves and give back to the community through financial, physical and social support. Many times, religious education also prompts people to evaluate issues of truth, ethics and faith within their personal lives. Parents should make every effort for your child to attend every week SOCL classes. This goes for adults as well for there is much to learn.

Key Phrase: "Who is my neighbor?"

Luke 10:29

Readings: This is one of the most superb classics about human kindness in all literature. Jesus intimates that heaven will be inhabited by those who have learned how to be kind and only kind and always kind. He also insinuates that there are going to be some surprises in the Day of Judgment. Jesus, by what He said, would rather see that in His followers the trait of kindness be found. Some who have been accustomed to think of themselves as very religious are going to find out, after it is too late, that they have been altogether overlooking the things the recording angels have been taking down, the treatment and lack of compassion to others. Jesus further makes the remarkable statement that not one single act of kindness, no matter how small, will ever go unrewarded. However, we must remember that Jesus does not mean that we should give encouragement to able bodied lazy people. Laziness is one of the greatest of sins. The Bible nowhere excuses it. "If any man will not work neither let him eat." (II Thessalonians 3:10)

**Reflection:** Would I be like the Good Samaritan and sacrifice my time and money to help someone in need or be concerned only for myself? Most people would not, especially in a society that only concerns themselves with their selves. As we were reminded in last week's teachings, we are to "be doers and not only hearers of the Word". Easily said but do I do that? May we reflect upon the Scripture Lessons presented today on this solemnity. The Church and our parish would greatly benefit.

**Praying:** Heavenly Father, Lord Jesus, open my heart and teach me to love as I have been loved by You. Help me to recognize all my neighbors. This I pray through Jesus Christ, my Lord.
